

Waynesville High School Summer School

June 1 – June 29, 2023

7:15 a.m. to 1:45 p.m.

A free **on-site** Summer School program will be offered from 7:15 a.m. to 1:45 p.m. June 1-June 29 for students entering grades 9-12. Current 8th grade students will attend 9th grade Summer School courses. The first session will be held June 1-14; the second session will be held June 15-June 29. **Please note that school will not be in session on Monday, June 19th as we will be observing the Juneteenth holiday.**

A student may enroll in one course for $\frac{1}{2}$ credit (one session) or two courses for one full credit (both sessions). To receive credit, a student must attend ALL of the days within a session.

Any student who is absent any day from any course will not receive credit and will be dropped from the program. There will be no make-up for missed time. Please also see the definitions below:

TARDY-A student is tardy if the student is outside the classroom when the tardy bell rings. Students will be dismissed when they receive their third tardy in a session.

ABSENT-Any student missing 20 minutes of class will be marked absent for the entire day.

Summer courses are designed to allow students to make up credit or allow students to enroll in courses for enrichment. Enrollment will be limited and advance registration is required. If there is any concern that a student may fail the second semester and wishes to make up the credit during summer school, the application should be completed.

To enroll, students should complete the application form and return it to their guidance counselor no later than April 14, 2023. Those students needing to make up credit toward graduation need to see their guidance counselor immediately. Due to limited class sizes, applications will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis.

Discipline

Summer school discipline problems will be handled expeditiously. Any student causing a problem will be dropped immediately from the program with no credit issued. Students are subject to the rules of Waynesville High School.

Breakfast & Lunch

Breakfast and lunch will be available at Waynesville High School during summer school, June 1-June 29.

Bus Transportation

Limited bus routes and stops will be provided and students in kindergarten through 12th grades may be consolidated on the same buses during Summer School.

<u>Virtual Courses (June 1-June 29)</u>- A limited number of virtual courses will be available through the LAUNCH Virtual Education program. Students enrolled in virtual courses complete the courses from home at a time of the day that works best for the student. Students will utilize their own devices to access virtual courses, the district will not provide devices. Students who enroll in one virtual course may take one on-site summer school course at WHS, students enrolled in two virtual courses will not be able to take any onsite summer school courses. Each virtual course is ½ credit. These courses are available to grade levels 9 - 12 unless otherwise noted.
