

Waynesville Middle School Summer School

June I - June 29, 2023

A tuition-free onsite summer school program will be available to all students this summer.

Two types of courses are available to middle school students: enrichment and remediation. Enrichment classes are available for those students wanting to learn more about a subject or explore new ideas and concepts. (See course descriptions for more information.) Remediation classes will be assigned via administrative placement only. If your child would like to attend Summer School, please complete the attached form and return to the WMDS Guidance Office by **April 14th**. Late registration will be on a space-available basis after April 14th. Sixth graders going into 7th grade will have a set schedule of academic-based electives, MS Boot camp, and PE (some students may be placed in intervention classes based on need). While the Middle School Campus was undergoing various construction projects the past few years, summer school was held at the high school. We are excited to announce that summer school for our students who are entering 7th and 8th grades will be moving back to Waynesville Middle School this summer.

Please note that Summer School will not be in session on Monday, June 19th, in observance of the Juneteenth holiday.

Attendance & Behavior

With just 20 days of summer school, a commitment to perfect attendance is critical. A student will be dropped from the program after two absences unless prior arrangements are made and approved by administration. Excessive tardiness (three times) will also result in dismissal from summer school. Exemplary behavior and citizenship is the expectation during summer school. A student who proves to be disruptive and receives 3 referrals during summer school will be dropped from the program.

Breakfast & Lunch

Breakfast and lunch will be offered at Waynesville Middle School during summer school, June 1-June 29.

Bus Transportation

Limited bus routes and stops will be provided and students in kindergarten through 12th grades may be consolidated on the same buses during Summer School. The 2022 Summer School stops will be posted at http://www.waynesville.k12.mo.us/Page/2495 by the end of April.

WMDS 2023 ON-SITE SUMMER SCHOOL COURSE OFFERINGS

REMEDIAL CLASSES-

6th-8th GRADE REMEDIAL MATH - This course will be assigned via administrative placement only.

6th-8th GRADE REMEDIAL ELA - This course will be assigned via administrative placement only.

7th-8th GRADE REMEDIAL SCIENCE - This course will be assigned via administrative placement only.

7th-8th GRADE REMEDIAL SOCIAL STUDIES - This course will be assigned via administrative placement only.

WORLD CULTURES

In this course, students will interactively explore the varying cultures, languages, foods, and inhabitants of the continents of Asia/Australia, Europe, South America, and Africa. This course will offer project-based learning opportunities by allowing students to create research-based brochures, PowerPoint, and comic life strips. This course is available to all students.

COME OUT AND PLAY!

This course emphasizes increased physical fitness and flexibility through standard physical education practices. Classroom activities will promote the productive use of leisure time while improving motor skills, social skills, and intellectual competency. This course is available to all students.

SPORTS EXTRAVAGANZA

This course offers an opportunity for increased physical strength and conditioning through participation in various sports and activities. Throughout the course, students will be exposed to basketball, football, dodge ball, soccer, track and field, volleyball, and whiffle ball. This course is available to all students.

HEALTH-RELATED FITNESS

In this course, students will learn how to incorporate and maintain physical fitness in their everyday lives. Emphasis will be placed on the beginning levels of cardiovascular and weight training. Students will learn basic body systems and how these systems improve and promote a healthy lifestyle and healthy living. This course will promote a project-based learning opportunity by allowing students to chart daily fitness levels and eating habits, and adjust these daily habits to promote positive change. This course is available to all students.

MS BOOT CAMP. COLLEGE & CAREER READINESS. & STUDY SKILLS

(7th Grade Mandatory and New Students Only, 8th grade welcome))

Students new to WMS will be able to learn the intricate workings of our middle school policies, procedures, expectations and extra-curricular opportunities. Students will also familiarize themselves with the layout of the building and create an electronic middle school "survival guide". The class is focused on preparing new students at WMS for success through creating positive and lasting relationships. This course is available to incoming 7th graders and students who are new to the district. Students will also explore and be introduced to a broad range of career opportunities in today's working society. Students will identify and research careers best suited for their personal interests, skills & values. Particularly, students will focus their efforts on career awareness, educational/career planning and improving their marketability as a prospective employee. Students will also learn study skills and other ways to manage school work at the middle school level.

CSI WAYNESVILLE

Have you ever wondered how crime scenes are analyzed and used to help capture the bad guys? This course allows students to gain a better understanding of the criminal justice system while putting scientific and investigative practice to use. Students will be gain first-hand experience from professionals who currently serve in related fields. At the end of the course, students will put their knowledge to work and investigate evidence from a fictional crime scene to identify potential suspects of the crime. This course is available to incoming 7th graders and students who are new to the district.

TEEN LIVING

This fast paced and exciting course is geared to meet the needs of the adolescent learner. Students who participate will gain an increased understanding of independence and responsibility through first hand experiences. The course will examine life management skills in relation to wellness, nutrition, living environments, childcare, hygiene and teen responsibility. Come join the fun and prepare yourself for the future! This course is available to all students.

SCIENCE EXPLORATORY

We are going to have a lot of fun in Science Exploratory this summer. We are going to build bridges and test their strength. Make bottle rockets and shoot them into the air. Design and construct Newton Scooters and compete with each other in distance trials. We will be learning about composting and gardening at the outdoor community garden. Learn about water quality and test local river waters for chemicals, and a whole lot more. This course is available for all students.

TIGER LEADERSHIP CAMP

Tiger Leadership Camp is a hands-on, character development experience that will prepare students for their futures. Students will establish leadership and character skills through activities such as canoeing, community service, team building and geo-caching. Students will be given opportunities to be in leadership positions throughout the camp. Activities are subject to change.
