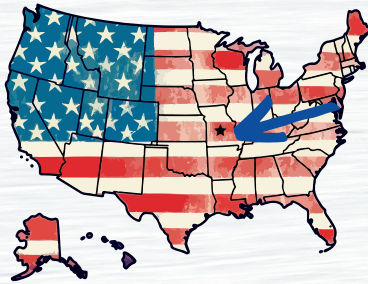

Q. Why is Prop 2 on the ballot?

A. A 10-cent tax levy increase would keep the district eligible for B-2 funding

Q. What is B-2 Heavily Impacted Aid?



B-2 Heavily Impacted Aid is \$8,500,000 in Federal tax dollars that the district receives each year by meeting certain criteria (see below)

Q. What are B-2 funds used for?

- A.**
- maintenance
 - upkeep
 - remodeling & construction



Upcoming repairs include:

- \$4.3 million for roofs
- \$12 million for HVAC
- \$1.5 million for parking lots

Q. For Waynesville R-VI to be eligible for B-2, what three criteria must the district meet?

- 1 Have a high % of military impacted students
- 2 Spend the right amount of money per pupil
- 3 Meet the federal government's "reasonable" local tax levy requirement*

**The U.S. Department of Education defines "reasonable" as having a local tax levy that is within 95% of a comparable group. Waynesville R-VI is at 95.13%.*

Q. What is the ratio of the new local tax revenue compared to the \$8.5 million in B-2 funds?

A. For every \$1 in new local taxes, the district would remain eligible to receive \$22 in Federal B-2 funds

Q. How much would a 10-cent tax levy cost the average taxpayer?

A. A 10-cent tax levy increase would mean the owner of a \$200,000 home and \$60,000 worth of vehicles would pay about \$5 more a month in taxes

The district has 11 schools

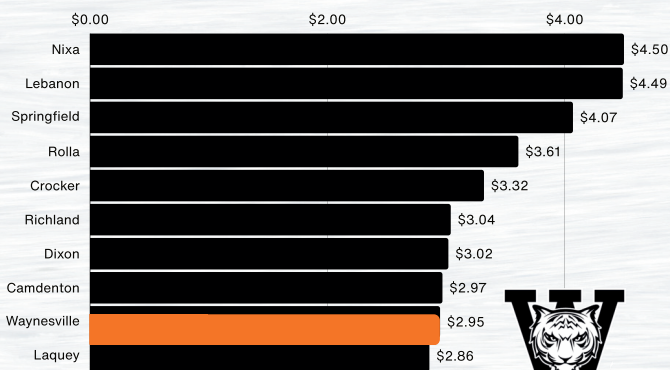


The district has no bond debt



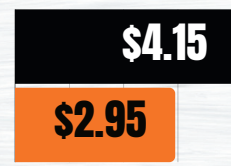

Q. Prop 2 asks for a 10-cent tax levy on the April 2 ballot. How would the new local tax revenue be used?

 - retaining quality staff and teachers
