Keeps \$8,500,000 in Federal tax dollars coming back to our local community every single year



B-2 pays for

Upcoming repairs include:

\$4.3 million for roofs \$12 million for HVAC \$1.5 million for parking lots

For Waynesville R-VI to be eligible for B-2, three criteria must be met:

- 1 Have a high % of military impacted students
- 2 Spend the right amount of money per pupil
- Meet the federal government's "reasonable" local tax levy requirement*

*The U.S. Department of Education defines "reasonable" as having a local tax levy that is within 95% of a comparable group. Waynesville R-VI is at 95.13%.


A 10-cent tax levy increase on April 2, 2024, would mean that for every \$1 in new local taxes, \$22 in Federal B-2 funds will be preserved.
